Attendance

If your child is going to be absent from school, please ensure you ring the school office to inform us of this. This office will call if they do not hear from you to ensure everyone is safe and seek reason for absence. Please ensure your contact details are up to date,

Medical appointments should be avoided during the school day. However, if children do need to leave for an appointment, evidence will be required of this. Without this, children are expected to be in school everyday from 8:40am to 3:00pm.

We monitor all children's attendance and will speak to you if your child's attendance if falling below an acceptable rate.

Gate Times

The gates on Peartree and Oakley John will open for 8:30 every morning ready for the children to come into school. A member of the leadership team will be on each gate should you need to speak to us. Gates will close at 8:40 when the children should be in school. If your child arrives late, they will need to enter through the school office.

Gates will open just before 3pm in the evening. We cannot open them earlier due to PE lessons on the playground. Gates will close at 3:15 to allow for any outdoor clubs to start promptly. Thank you for your cooperation.
